THE KITCHEN 08: Invisible lines of thought - materializing Esuama, place of Authority an exhibition by Lucie Draai, Billytown, Den Haag, 11 september - 22 oktober 2016

ESUAMA means Place of Authority, (an intersection where the priest can connect to the spiritual world, a place that connects the one with the other) to the Kogi, a indian tribe living today in the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta, to the north of Colombia. The Kogis belong to the macro-Chibcha linguistic family, although affected by colonisation, they have been relatively spared; they have been able to keep their language, their worship and their dress. The information gathered about them in the last twenty five years is of considerable interest from the point of view of knowledge of the symbolism which was, without doubt, characteristic of the whole Chibcha group and thus the Muiscas, for it reveals the existence of a sacred geography of fundamental importance in the life of these tribes even at the present day.
